As Lions we keep hearing about succession planning. Where will your club be in 5, 10, and 15 years? Will your club still be around? Does your club have a succession plan?

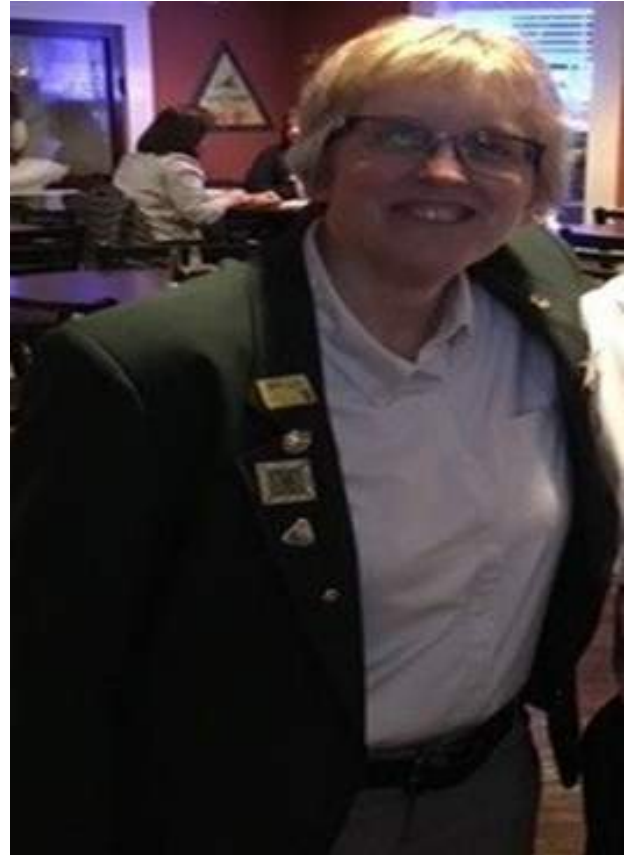
You'll get to know that I'm a sports fan, cheering for the Baltimore Orioles, Pittsburgh Steelers, and Duke Men's Basketball team. Just like Lions, sports teams need to have a succession plan. I want to give you two examples, one team clearly had a succession plan, the other team clearly did not.

"Big Ben" Roethlisberger was a great quarterback for the Steelers. The owner, GM and coaching staff all knew "Big Ben's" time as a quarterback was coming to an end. The team tried backups Mason Rudolph and Mitch Trubisky; and then drafted local quarterback, Kenny Pickett. Mason and Mitch were not the answer. Kenny Pickett proved not to be the answer. The Steelers are now hoping that Russell Wilson or Justin Fields will be the answer next season. It's been a tough road for Steelers fans since "Big Ben" retired. Clearly there was no succession plan.

Coach Mike Krzyzewski or "Coach K" as he is known on the campus of Duke University, coached the men's basketball team for 42 years. He always had former players on his coaching staff. As his retirement was approaching, "Coach K" began grooming one of his former players and assistant coach, Jon Scheyer, to be his replacement. Because of the succession planning, this proved to be a very smooth transition; in just his second year as head coach, Jon Scheyer took his team to the Elite 8 in this year's March Madness.

Key dates

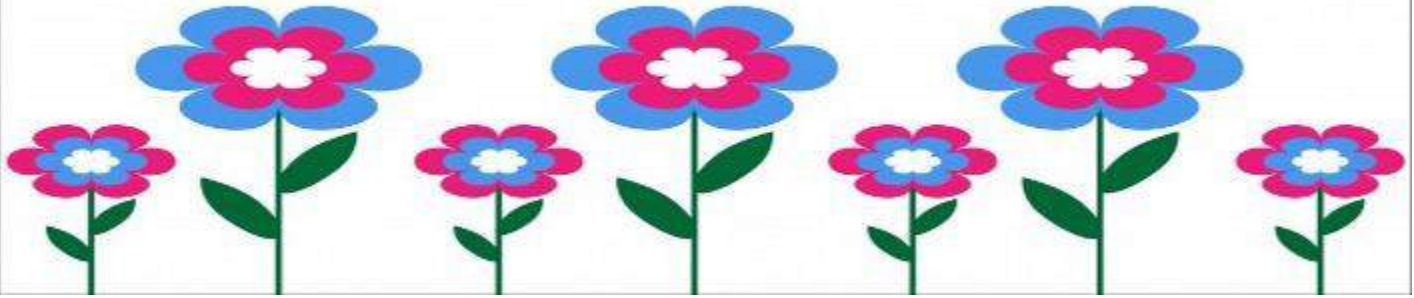
- **April 12 and beyond:** MyLion, MyLCl, and Insights are no longer available.

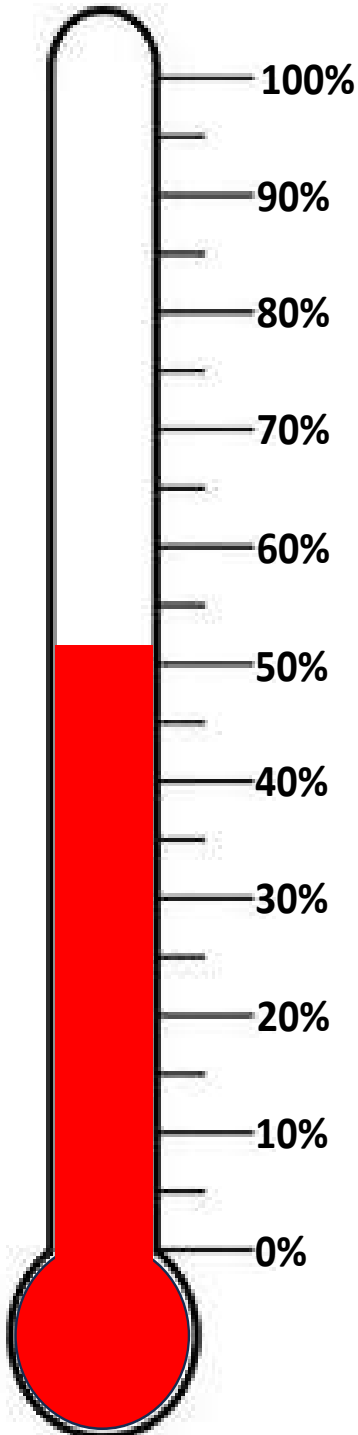
